Richard J. Hughes Humanitarian Award

For Thomas J. and Dr. Judithann C. Keefe, charitable giving is a vital virtue, instilled in childhood by their Catholic upbringing. "We're products of 13 years of a Catholic education," Judi said. "It was drilled in our heads. You were expected to give a dime a month for missions," Tom added. Both carried that compassion into their careers, where Tom remembers a Chamber of Commerce initiative to provide children in need with Christmas gifts. "Back then, you were supposed to spend \$10. My first time out, I had \$100 in my pocket - and I came home broke," he laughed.

They have been longtime supporters of Catholic Charities, Diocese of Trenton and served on the Guardian Angel Dinner Dance Planning Committee for years, chairing it in 2017. They like that Catholic Charities addresses all of a person's needs to achieve long-term stability. "Catholic Charities produces tangible, measurable results," Tom said. "Catholic Charities can give people a warm bed, a body to talk to, financial help – everyone has the need for someone that cares for them. Catholic Charities has the formula."

While need exists everywhere, the Keefes appreciate that their support improves their own community. "They say 'charity begins at home,' and this is charity at home, in your own backyard," Tom said. "Monmouth County has many affluent neighborhoods, but it also has a lot of people in need." Judi agreed: "When you become involved with Catholic Charities, you become part of a family. It's very warm. You're working toward a goal for other people."


Judi retired as assistant superintendent of Moorestown Township Public Schools after 32 years in public education. She was an adjunct professor at Monmouth and Fairleigh Dickinson universities. Tom had a long corporate career, including at Johnson & Johnson, Jockey International and Ideal Office Systems. They are members of the St. Catharine-St. Margaret Parish in Spring Lake, where they served on the parish Faith to Move Mountains committee and Judi is a lector and Eucharistic Minister and chaired the St. Catharine School Advisory Board. Tom is a sacristan for St. Catharine-St. Margaret Parish and St. Rose in Belmar.

Together since eighth grade, they have been married for 55 years. (The secret, Tom jokes, is two words – 'yes, dear.') They have two children and four grandchildren.

They were "humbled" to receive the Humanitarian Award.

"The reward for us is that other people are being helped," Judi said.

Burlington County Light of Hope Award



Deacon James L. Casa

When Deacon James L. Casa was preparing to become a deacon, he took many classes to ensure he'd be effective in his ministry. The classes ranged from spirituality, sacramental study and liturgical preparation to pastoral care, church history and homiletics. Yet what Deacon Jim found most compelling were the three weeks when Catholic Charities, Diocese of Trenton staff spoke to him and his classmates of the work, scope and vision of the 107-year-old social services agency. Ordained in 1996, Deacon Jim cemented his support of Catholic Charities' mission 10 years ago by joining its Burlington County Board. He has been an active member ever since.

Before he involves himself in any ministry, Deacon Jim prays the Gospel passage (Luke 4: 16-19) when Jesus told of His purpose "...to proclaim good news to the poor...to proclaim freedom for the prisoner...recovery of sight for the blind...to set the oppressed free...to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." For Deacon Jim, this is at the heart of the ministry of Catholic Charities.

Through various Catholic Charities programs, the light of Christ is tenderly brought to a hurting, confused and suffering world, Deacon Jim said. "Clearly, this brings the Gospel home to so many people and makes faith real," he added. Deacon Jim felt further called to action after reading that St. Paul VI advised: "If you want peace, work for justice." So several years ago, he joined Catholic Charities' Social Policy Committee, which sets the agency's advocacy agenda.

Since 1996, Deacon Jim has served the parish of Sacred Heart in Mount Holly.

He is a retired civil servant for Burlington County, where he worked as a transportation analyst and advocated for senior citizens and residents with disabilities. One county program that he introduced was a transportation cooperative that helped Catholic Charities clients who needed public transportation get to Delaware House in Westampton.

For the past five years, Deacon Jim developed a second career as a chaplain at Hampton Behavioral Health Center in Westampton, where he serves the spiritual needs for patients struggling with addiction and mental illness. He also serves the community as a chaplain for the Mount Holly Police Department. Deacon Jim and Emmy, his wife of 45 years, were high school sweethearts. They have two adult children.

Mercer County Light of Hope Award



Mary Jo Herbert

Mary Jo Herbert grew up in a farming family and community. Her family ran a seed store in Milltown, and she learned to care for and ride horses on her grandparents' peach farm in East Brunswick. She went to college to become a teacher, and there, met the man, Michael, who would become her husband. The couple moved to Trenton and had five children, while Michael grew his law practice.

Mary Jo yearned to return to farming. So the couple bought a farm in Hopewell, where she kept and bred Arabian and Thoroughbred racing horses, grew hay, raised chickens and taught riding. The farm, at its height, produced more than 3,000 bales of hay

and had more than 36 horses, many of which raced at the track. Watching a foal become a successful race horse gave her an incredible sense of accomplishment.

Mary Jo was a trailblazer, becoming the first female president of the New Jersey Thoroughbred Breeders Association and the State Board of Agriculture. She also was honored by the National Breeders' Cup. She serves on the New Jersey Farm Service Agency and the Mercer County Agriculture Board. "It was unusual for a woman to run a farm 35 years ago," she said.

Mary Jo and Michael felt driven to support Catholic Charities, Diocese of Trenton about 30 years ago after attending church at the Blessed Sacrament in Trenton and seeing firsthand how many people in the city struggled to provide for their families.

She organized food donations from local farms to Catholic Charities. She supports Catholic Charities' food pantries, saying healthy food is necessary for communities to thrive.

"Now with the COVID-19 pandemic, it is more important than ever that people have a healthy diet," said Mary Jo, who has supported Farmers Against Hunger initiatives that facilitated gleaning (a practice in which leftover crops, picked from farmers' fields after commercial harvesting, get donated to people in need).

Getting involved with Catholic Charities has been a family affair for the Herberts. Michael served as president of the Board of Trustees and was honored as a Light of Hope for Mercer County in 2004. Eldest son Michael W. Herbert is a current Board member.

Mary Jo still runs her 57-acre hay and horse-boarding farm, known as Hopewell Heritage Farm. She is a parishioner at Saint James Church in Pennington. She has five grown children, eight grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.

Dr. Jack V. Kirnan has a few favorite Bible verses, but none captures his commitment to community service like this passage from the Book of John: "I am the good shepherd; I know my sheep and my sheep know me— just as the Father knows me and I know the Father—and I lay down my life for the sheep. I have other sheep that are not of this sheep pen. I must bring them also."

"That, to me, really speaks to the mission of Catholic Charities," said Jack, who has supported Catholic Charities for years and served on our Board of Trustees since 2014. "Our mission is to be there for people who have lost their way. Like

a good shepherd, we go after lost sheep and bring hope to people who are at a difficult moment in their life."

Jack first got involved with Catholic Charities through his friend Bob Tanzola, a longtime Catholic Charities supporter. As a Trustee, Jack has chaired the Strategic Planning Board and serves on the Finance Committee. He's a former member of our Monmouth County Board.

"Working for Catholic Charities makes me more grateful for my blessings," Jack said. "When you see the struggles many people have, you reflect on what you have and how you can help others in need."

Jack appreciates that Catholic Charities helps everyone, regardless of faith or ability to pay.

"We don't care what your gender, sexual orientation or race may be or what country you come from," he said. "We want to be a bridge to your future. At the end of the day, we are all shepherds. We look at every sheep as a child of God. We want to help them cross that bridge to a better place called tomorrow."

Jack's compassion for others has affected his career path. After a long career in financial services and higher education, Jack now heads Kirnan Coaching Associates, LLC, which provides executive, career and life coaching. Jack is a parishioner, Trustee and Finance Committee member at St. Catharine-St. Margaret Parish in Spring Lake. A former president of the Parish Pastoral Council, Jack is a Eucharistic Minister, helps run the Parish Bereavement group, and serves on the Diocesan Planning Commission and as Secretary for Cohort 19 of the Diocesan Faith in Our Future Planning Initiative.

Jack and Jean, his wife of 40 years, have three children and two grandchildren.

Ocean County Light of Hope Award



Oceanaire Women's Golf Association

Years ago, when Bonnie Morris, Berti Avery and Betty Fedyna decided to organize a charitable luncheon and golf outing at their Ocean County retirement community, they asked around to see what causes people wanted to support. "One woman who I knew very well – a woman of means who has a beautiful house here – told me: 'Providence House saved my daughter. Without them, she would be dead now," Bonnie remembered. "It was so eyeopening, because it really showed us that domestic violence can affect anyone, anywhere. It impacts people of every race, class, gender and age. It's a

hidden epidemic that's local, happening right in our own communities."

So the women – members of the Oceanaire Women's Golf Association at the Greenbriar-Oceanaire Golf and Country Club in Waretown – decided to donate proceeds from their golf outing to Catholic Charities' Providence House Domestic Violence Services-Ocean. Providence House offers free, confidential domestic violence services, including a 24/7 hotline, a safe house for women and children recovering from domestic abuse and specialized education, counseling and support groups.

That was six years ago, and since then, the Oceanaire women have made the fundraiser an annual event, donating over \$100,000 to support Providence House-Ocean. "After we saw the safe house, we were all enthusiastic about continuing to support Providence House," Betty said. That enthusiasm was contagious, and the whole community got involved – the club waives all golf and park fees so more money goes toward fundraising; the men's club runs raffles and auctions that support fundraising; and residents of the community's 1,400 homes pitch in to fundraise in a street campaign, Betty said.

"We try to set up a tournament that's fun for everybody, whether you're a super-golfer or a beginner," Berti said. The outing typically draws about 150 people every June. The COVID-19 pandemic derailed this year's benefit, although the street fundraising campaign carried on, with residents raising about \$7,000 for Providence House.

"We really want to thank the whole community for their help in making this a success every year," Betty said. Berti added: "It's a lovely gesture on Catholic Charities' part to give us this award. This community loves helping people." Betty agreed: "We don't do it for the recognization; we do it for the pleasure we get in helping others."

Poverty and circumstance turned Robert into a law-breaker at the tender age of 9. With an absentee father, an abusive, mentally ill mother, and three younger brothers, Robert remembers well the desperation that drove him to steal food to feed his family and the shame that made him shoplift clothes to end his classmates' jeers. As a teenager and young man, selling drugs seemed the only reliable way to fill his pockets. His downward spiral deepened when he sampled the drugs and became addicted. The law soon caught up to him. For decades, Robert cycled from prison to the streets, and back again. By 2015, he was 50 years old – and behind bars again.

"A corrections officer asked me what I was doing there. I couldn't answer," Robert said. "I was always winding up in prison and not really knowing why."

Therapy offered answers. He was diagnosed with post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), and that diagnosis was a springboard to long-term recovery. When he told a therapist he wanted to help others avoid his fate, she implored him to first help himself. So he reached out to Catholic Charities, where he began his addiction recovery and continued counseling through the Partial Care Program. The intensive outpatient program offers addiction treatment, mental health services, and employment and housing assistance.

In 2017, he wrote a book called "Psychology of a Thug: Demystify," a raw retelling of everything he's survived, from being molested and shot twice to becoming a teenage father and overdosing.

In 2018, he became a peer mental health advocate at Catholic Charities' Early Intervention Support Services (EISS), a walk-up mental health program in Mercer County for people needing immediate mental health help.

Robert knows his past struggles offer lessons for others on his journey. Indeed, he goes by the nickname "the Thug Doctor" and works to destignatize mental illness in hopes of inspiring people, particularly in underserved urban areas, to get help.

Robert now is studying at Camden County Community College to become a certified alcohol and drug counselor. He plans to pursue degrees in social work to become a clinician. Recovery is an ongoing journey with the destination always still ahead, he said. "I'm not where I want to be, but where I'm supposed to be," he said. "School is just another step on my journey. Hopefully there will be many more steps."
