and is shown in the respect for the dignity of each person who comes to them for assistance.

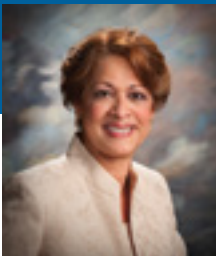
We are grateful to all at Catholic Charities who accompany those in need on their journey. We thank the board of trustees and each of you as donors and volunteers who support and share in this important mission.

## There's No Place Like Home

Marita Axten did not click her heels together three times, but did repeatedly assert that “There’s no place like home,” referring to her family’s nearly three-year odyssey to rebuild following Hurricane Sandy’s devastating impact on their home in 2012. The mother of four grown children had tears in her eyes as she recounted what it took to finally return home.

The Axtens received a “homecoming” reception early this summer, coordinated by Catholic Charities’ Disaster Response Program Case Manager Asma Taqi. “It was great to have the participation of the many groups and volunteers with whom we collaborated there to welcome Marita home,” says Taqi.

Partnering organizations included the American Red Cross, Visitation Relief Center, the Ocean and Monmouth Long Term Recovery

Groups, the St. Bernard Project and the St. Vincent dePaul Society.

### TURNING POINT

When Marita first visited her home just days after Sandy, she barely recognized what had been left in its wake. What followed was a nightmarish journey through bureaucratic tangles and a challenging battle with her insurance company to rebuild the home that had been flooded with several feet of saltwater. The persistence and determination of Marita and her children Joseph, Jason, James and Jennifer paid off when FEMA connected the family with the Disaster Response Program in July of 2013.

In April of that year, Governor Christie’s administration charged Catholic Charities, Diocese of Trenton with managing the statewide

delivery of disaster response services. Case manager Randy Widrick worked closely with Marita to assess the current situation, identify what was needed and advocate for the home’s demolition and rebuilding. He was able to guide the family using his knowledge of mortgage financing, the permitting process and construction.

Marita and her children provide an inspiration of the power and determination of faith. As Catholic Charities’ Executive Director Marlene Laó-Collins greeted the family at their homecoming she noted that, “We carry in our hearts you and so many of the other families we work with to try and get back into their homes.”

## Longtime Passionate Advocate Retires

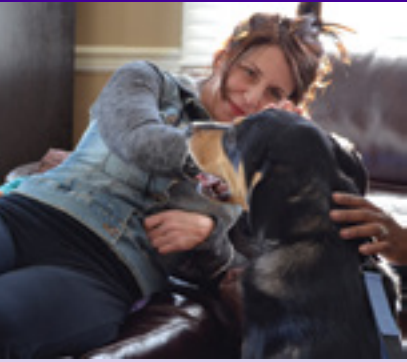
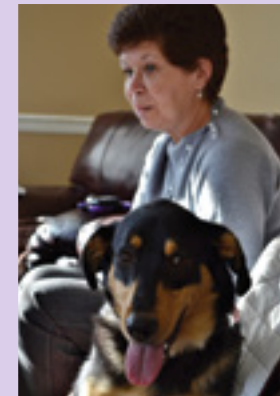

A former social worker with a background of working with abused kids, Cheryl says she feels like her life is coming full circle through her therapy work with Henry.

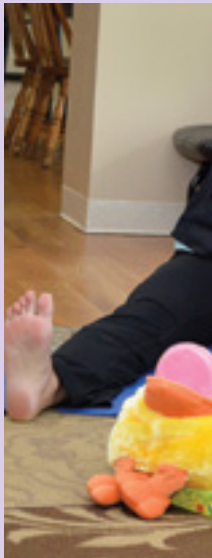
Henry will continue his rounds at Providence House twice a month and Cheryl also plans to have him start working with veterans who are suffering from PTSD and victims of human trafficking.

## NEW GENERATORS INSTALLED AT BOTH SAFE HOUSES

Ken Adam of Catholic Charities' Maintenance team (pictured at left) and Mary Pettrow, Associate Director of Providence House, were "the boots on the ground" during Hurricane Sandy

and learned first-hand the vulnerabilities that faced the residential programs in the dark and cold days that followed.

This experience sparked their united efforts in 2014 to obtain over \$100,000 in state funding to install two natural gas powered full-house generators for both the Ocean and Burlington County Safe Houses.

The generators come on within a split second of a power outage. There is no need to venture outside and pour gasoline into a manually operated generator as staff had to do previously.

"The generators will ensure that both Safe Houses have lights, heat, refrigeration, a fully functioning crisis telephone hotline and security systems to reduce the trauma and fear that extended power outages can create," says Adam.

## Project Hope Empowers Consumers



Ocean Community Services' Project Hope Health and Wellness Education and Prevention Services is designed to help economically disadvantaged residents of Ocean County effect changes in their health practices. This includes learning about healthy lifestyles, identifying potential health risks, obtaining treatment and developing a plan with a case manager

to meet basic and health care needs. It is partially funded by the Horizon Foundation for New Jersey.

Project Hope's ESL Health Literacy workshop is a 10-week course, held twice annually, that helps limited English proficient participants acquire the basic medical information and vocabulary they need to maintain their health and the health of family members.

The workshop culminates in a Mock Healthcare Clinic where participants put into practice concepts they studied over nine weeks. As they would at an actual clinic, participants fill out a health history form, communicate their health concerns and symptoms, and ask questions about treatment or medication, in English, with volunteer "medical practitioners" who work at the clinic. Instructor Jennifer Morgan says the workshop "provides participants with important tools and helps build their confidence so that they can improve the quality of their lives."

## Whole Consumer a Focus at Partial Care Program

Apart from differences in the types of services offered, all of the mental health services offered at Catholic Charities focus on helping consumers achieve their highest level of functioning and life quality.

This is easily demonstrated by the Partial Care program in Burlington County, housed on Ikea Drive in Westampton. Partial Care is a service that offers a range of outpatient, intensive and psychiatric rehabilitation opportunities for adults experiencing any of the following:

- An acute onset or reoccurrence of a pre-existing mental illness
- Severe and persistent mental illness
- Mental illness as well as a co-occurring disorder, such as substance dependence

### TEAM APPROACH

Comprehensive integrated care is coordinated through a multidisciplinary clinical team that includes:

- Psychiatric RNs
- Licensed clinical social workers
- Case managers

## COMMUNITY SERVICES RECEIVES \$40K GRANT FROM WALMART FOUNDATION



Burlington Community Services was a recipient of a \$40,000 grant from the Walmart Foundation to perform outreach, education and enrollment assistance to residents in Burlington, Mercer, Monmouth and Ocean counties interested in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP). This is the second year Burlington Community Services received the grant and in 2014, used the grant to provide outreach and education to 425 individuals — 242 of whom were provided with enrollment assistance and 236 of whom received SNAP benefits. The 2015 goals of this grant are to expand outreach, provide enrollment assistance to 320 individuals and achieve SNAP benefits for 300.



## A PACT That Makes a Difference

When we see or hear the word “pact,” we routinely associate it with an agreement or a contract. That is due to its deep roots in the 14<sup>th</sup> Century Latin “pactum” meaning “covenant” or to “join together, to fix.”

At Catholic Charities, the acronym PACT (Program of Assertive Community Treatment) refers to comprehensive, locally based treatment for people with serious and persistent mental illnesses. PACT team members include social workers, psychiatric RNs and other professionals in providing individualized services directly to consumers.

PACT consumers receive

multidisciplinary, round-the-clock services within the comfort of their own home and community. To have the competencies and skills to meet a client’s multiple treatment, rehabilitation and support needs, PACT team members are trained in the areas of psychiatry, social work, nursing, substance abuse and vocational rehabilitation. The PACT team provides these necessary services 24 hours a day, seven days a week, 365 days a year.

“We accompany each of our consumers on their journey to successfully manage their mental illness,” observes PACT Program Director Drew Wisloski, referring to

Programming consists of skill development, wellness activities and counseling. For individuals whose goals include re-employment, activities and support are provided to facilitate the return to work.

Through this comprehensive approach, 93 percent of individuals in Partial Care have avoided psychiatric hospitalization and are able to function and live independently within their communities. Additionally, 90 percent avoided a medical ER visit during their time in the program.

### HOW A PACT TEAM WORKS

PACT team members (*Mercer Team III pictured at right*) strive to reduce the symptoms of mental illness, prevent recurrent acute episodes of the illness, help meet basic needs and enhance quality of life. PACT minimizes the recurrence of hospitalization and enables consumers to live independently within their own community.

For aging parents of adults living with serious mental illness, the PACT team is an invaluable partner, easing some of the concerns they have if they predecease their child. In an interview with *The Star Ledger* in 2009, Alicia Nash expressed this concern, “When I am gone, will Johnny be living in the street?” (*see Editor’s Note, page 9*)

## Evidence Based Treatment Helps Child Trauma Victims

Renown child psychologist Jean Piaget famously observed “Play is the work of children.” His extensive research taught him that through creative activities, children learn important information and develop skills. The treatment provided by clinicians at the Monmouth/Ocean Family Growth program for children impacted by trauma incorporates play and creative arts techniques into the structure of evidence based treatment.

The primary approach utilized with children (ages 3-18) is Trauma-Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (T-F CBT). This evidence based treatment is appropriate for children who have had one or more traumas and are experiencing symptoms of post-traumatic stress. It is a structured short term (4-6 months) approach that helps children manage their feelings, talk about the trauma and develop plans for feeling safe in the future.

Parents or caregivers are strongly engaged and taught how to help the child practice coping skills at home and after

treatment has been completed. Therapeutic toys and games are used throughout treatment to help children express feelings and tell their story in a comfortable, age appropriate manner.

Parent-Child Interactive Therapy (PCIT) is an evidence based treatment for young children (ages 2-6) with conduct disorders that places emphasis on improving the quality of the parent-child relationship. It utilizes a live parent coaching technique while the parent and child are engaged in play with



toys. This treatment has resulted in increases in positive parenting behaviors and children have shown increases in compliance and decreases in negative behaviors.

multi-purpose resource center for the Hispanic community.

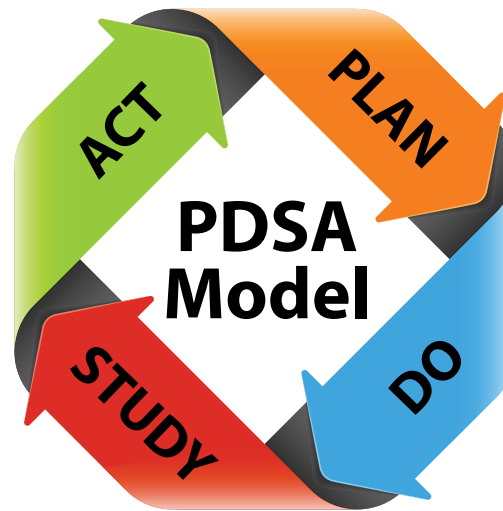

# Creating a Culture of Learning to Improve Services and Outcomes



To engage all employees in the process of quality improvement, Catholic Charities adopted a new problem-solving model referred to as Plan-Do-Study-Act (PDSA) early in 2015. “This is a quality improvement tool that empowers employees at every level and in every position to examine and refine practices with the end goal being improved services and outcomes,” says Bob Hodnett, Associate Director, Children and Family Services. Hodnett is leading the PDSA implementation and started off with training agency staff.

## PDSA BOOT CAMP

Multiple training sessions were held between March and May, with approximately 300 employees participating. Sessions were held in all four counties in all programs/ departments with staff at all levels attending. “Employees expressed many positive responses to the PDSA model during the trainings and were excited to implement it in their programs,” says Hodnett.

## PRACTICE MAKES PERFECT

The trainings involved a hands-on application of the PDSA model — during the training session. Staff were asked to form groups with others from their program or similar programs and were walked through a PDSA plan of their choosing.

## NEXT STEPS

The focus of adopting this new model is to improve the quality of services to our consumers which will ultimately lead to greater positive outcomes. “When staff at all levels in every department participate in the PDSA process starting this summer, studies will be completed quickly and improvements can be made right away,” says Hodnett. All PDSA studies will be structured to generate data which will be used in determining what, if any, changes need to be implemented.

“The overarching goal in adopting the PDSA model is to create a learning environment in the agency in which we are constantly examining our practices and learning from our experience in a systematic and strategic manner,” Hodnett explains.

the partnership forged between consumers and their counselors.

Referrals are made to the PACT program from social service agencies or in-patient facilities, but that is changing. Owing to the advocacy efforts of NAMI (National Alliance for the Mentally Ill), many families now directly contact PACT for help managing the needs of relatives living with mental illness. One such family was the Nashes, who sought help from PACT in 2005 on behalf of their son, John F. Nash, Jr.

*Editor’s Note: Tragically, John and Alicia Nash were killed in a car accident while returning home from a trip to Norway to accept the prestigious Abel Prize for his work in mathematics. Nash’s work and his struggle with mental illness received wide attention through the book and film, “A Beautiful Mind.” In the early 2000s, both John and Alicia became powerful advocates in the fight to destigmatize mental illness.*

*Drew Wisloski, the PACT team lead for John Nash, Jr. said, “It was a very difficult time for everyone, but we were grateful to have been able to help by offering ongoing support.”*

*True to the root definition of “pact,” Wisloski and his PACT team continue to honor their covenant with consumers.*

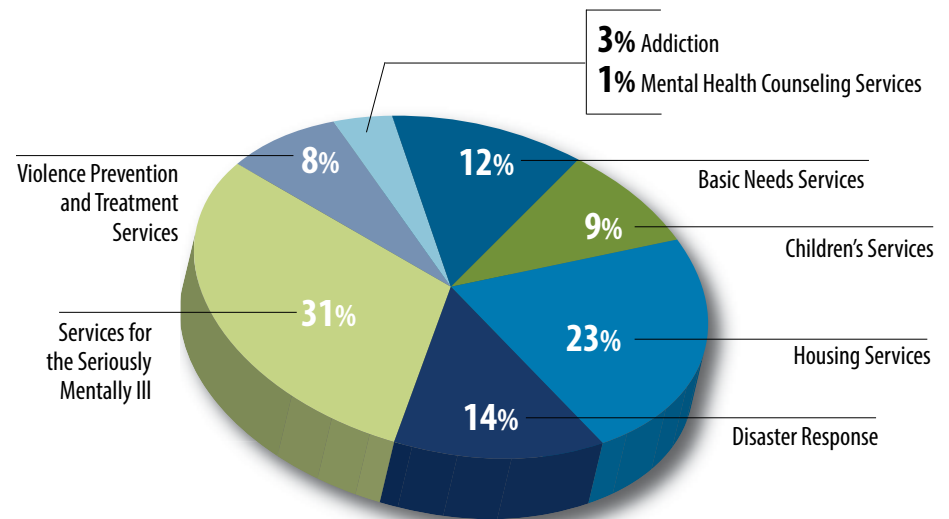
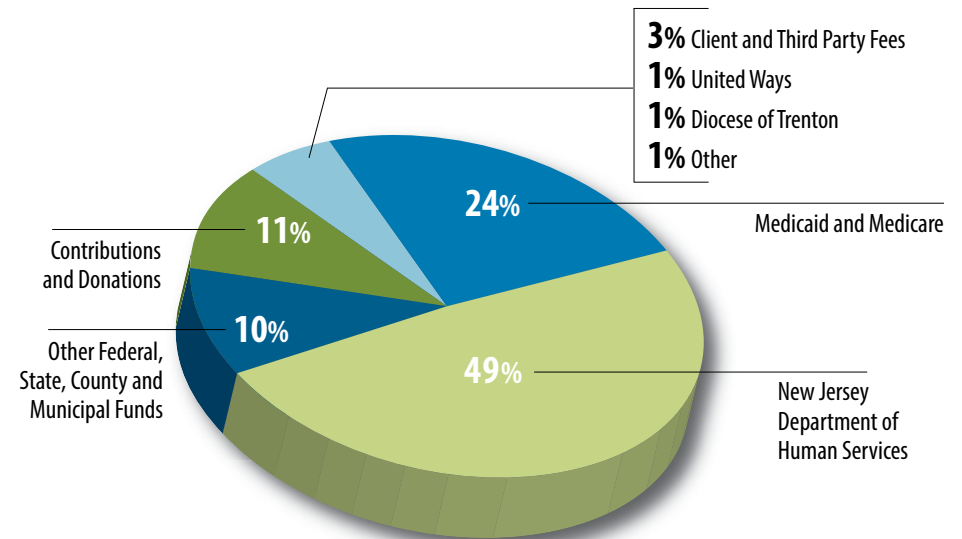

## DONATION BINS PROVE TO BE HUGE SUCCESS

In 2014, the donation bins located in and around Ocean and Monmouth counties generated more than \$20,150, with \$17,013 going to Community Services and \$3,145 going to Providence House.

The donation bin initiative was sparked by Executive Director, Marlene Laó-Collins, who learned about it from her colleague at Catholic Charities, Diocese of Paterson. She then thoroughly vetted the provider, Sentinel Management Corp., and interviewed some of the parish contacts who were already working with Sentinel for feedback.

Sentinel provides the bins at no cost to Catholic Charities and is responsible for placing, emptying and maintaining the bins. The idea was approved and implemented by Catholic Charities' Social Enterprise Committee.

Thanks to the donations collected, Catholic Charities was able to provide additional assistance for rent and utilities to 12 families and nine individuals.

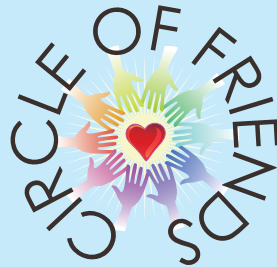
